Dear Public Service Director,

Right now, more than 120,000 children, through no fault of their own, are waiting to be adopted from foster care in the United States — a 20% increase since 2012.

Our nation's child welfare system is being stretched far beyond its capacity as families are devastated by the opioid crisis and other issues. Unresolved through policy and evidence-based, innovative practices, this problem has far-reaching impacts. Last year, more than 20,000 teens turned 18 or 21 and aged out of care without a permanent home. With nowhere to turn for support, many are at a higher risk of negative outcomes, such as homelessness, unemployment and early, unplanned parenting, which can happen to a child who can't go home and simply say, "I need some help."

Created in 1992 by Wendy's[®] founder Dave Thomas, who was adopted, the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption is the only public nonprofit charity in the United States focused exclusively on foster care adoption.

Through the Wendy's Wonderful Kids(R) program, the Foundation provides funding and establishes innovative co-investment partnerships with states to support the hiring of recruiters who implement an evidence-based, child-focused recruitment model. This model has been proven to be up to three times more effective at finding adoptive homes for children who have been lingering in foster care the longest.

With support from the Foundation's generous donors, the Foundation has helped find forever families for more than 9,500 children across the United States. But there is more work to be done to serve children still waiting to be adopted who need our help the most.

Dear Applicant:

This modifies our letter of the above date in which we stated that you would be treated as an organization that is not a private foundation until the expiration of your advance ruling period.

Your exempt status under section SO1(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in section SO1(c)(3) is still in effect. Based on the information you submitted, we have determined that you are not a private foundation within the meaning of section SO9(a) of the Code because you are an organization of the type described in section SO9(a)(2).

Grantors and contributors may rely on this determination unless the Internal Revenue Service publishes notice to the contrary. Nowever, if you lose your section 509(a)(2) status, a grantor or contributor may not rely on this determination if he or she was in part responsible for, or was aware of, the act or failure to act, or the substantial or material change on the part of the organization that resulted in your loss of such status, or if he or she acquired knowledge that the Internal Revenue Service had given notice that you would no longer be classified as a section 509(a)(2) organization.

If we have indicated in the heading of this letter that an addendum applies, the addendum enclosed is an integral part of this letter.

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your private foundation status, please keep it in your permanent records.
