Dear Public Service Director,

This winter has brought some unusual weather to different parts of the country. For example, the typically sunny Southern California has been hit with massive snowstorms while some areas of the Northeast, which usually face harsh winter weather, are enjoying record warmth and minimal snow. These types of changes can impact how pests affect our environment and surroundings. Colder temperatures will cause rodents to seek shelter indoors which can lead to pest problems in our homes. A warmer-than-normal winter can cause pests like ticks, mosquitoes and cockroaches to get an early start to their peak season. All of this makes it important for us to remain vigilant about protecting our health and safety from disease-carrying pests, especially as spring approaches and we begin to spend more time outdoors. A number of pests are capable of transmitting diseases to humans and pose significant threats to our health and well-being.

Ticks found in tall grass around the home can spread Lyme disease and other illnesses which can lead to chronic health issues. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that nearly half a million people across the country are diagnosed with Lyme disease each year. Allergens left behind by dust mites, roaches and rodents are a major driver of asthma attacks, especially in children. Mosquitoes spread West Nile virus and many other diseases. Additionally, they can breed in standing water around the home.

Awareness and education are critical for safeguarding our communities from pestrelated health threats. Your station can help by airing the public service announcement (PSA), titled **"Abstract" (:60, :30)**. This timely PSA uses animated visual metaphors to help educate audiences about the symptoms and harmful effects caused by pest-related health conditions. The PSA also includes an informational website, <u>PestWorld.org</u>, which offers further details and educational resources. We ask that you please air this PSA as soon and as often as **possible.** There is no end date for use.

The NPMA is a nonprofit organization committed to the protection of public health, food and property from the diseases and dangers posed by common household pests. The association conducts public education and awareness programs to promote increased vigilance around the home.

"Abstract" (:60)	
1. Animated visual environment, switch to a shot of a rash with a red bulls-eye ring around it. Switch to a shot of a medical diagnosis screen, switch to a shot of a clock graphic.	MUSIC UP AND UNDER MAN V/O: I thought it was just a rash but it had a bulls- eye ring around it, my doctor said it was a tick bite. Luckily, we caught it early.
2. Animated shot of tall grass with a tick crawling. <b>GRAPHIC</b> : LYME DISEASE ROCKY MOUNTAIN SPOTTED FEVER AND OTHER SERIOUS DISEASES	<b>NARRATOR V/O</b> : Ticks found in tall grass around your home can spread Lyme disease and other illnesses which can lead to chronic health issues.
3. Animated map of the United States. GRAPHIC: CDC ESTIMATES NEARLY 500,000 CASES OF LYME DISEASE PER YEAR NATIONWIDE	<b>NARRATOR V/O</b> : The CDC estimates nearly half a million people across the country are diagnosed with Lyme disease each year.
4. Animated shot of an asthma inhaler, switch to a shot of lungs with arms hugging. Shot of house and animated roaches.	<b>CHILD V/O</b> : I didn't understand why my brother was having so many asthma flare-ups. Sometimes he couldn't breathe. Turns out a roach problem at home was triggering it.

5. Animated shot of house transitions to dusk colors. Shot of blinking eyes in shadow next to the home. <b>GRAPHIC</b> : PEST ALLERGENS CAN TRIGGER ASTHMA ATTACKS WITH GREATER INCIDENCES IN CHILDREN	<b>NARRATOR V/O</b> : Allergens left behind by dust mites, roaches and rodents are a major driver of asthma attacks, especially in children.
<ul> <li>6. Animated shot of a thermometer, an icon of a person and sleeping "Zzzz" graphic. Switch to a shot of a mosquito surrounded by flowers.</li> <li>GRAPHIC: WEST NILE VIRUS</li> </ul>	<b>WOMAN V/O</b> : When I had a fever, body aches, and fatigue I never thought it would have been West Nile virus. All it took was a mosquito bite while gardening.
7. Animated shot of diseases on screen. Switch to a shot of a bird drinking from a bird bath. <b>GRAPHIC</b> : WEST NILE VIRUS MALARIA CHIKUNGUNYA EASTERN EQUINE ENCEPHALITIS (EEE) DENGUE FEVER AND MORE	<b>NARRATOR V/O</b> : Mosquitoes spread West Nile virus and many other diseases. And they can breed in standing water around your home.

Dear Applicant:

Based on information supplied, and assuming your operations will be as stated in your application for recognition of exemption, we have determined you are exempt from Federal income tax under section SO1(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in the section indicated above.

Unless specifically excepted, you are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) for each employee to whom you pay \$100 or more during a calendar year. And, unless excepted, you are also liable for tax under the Federal Unemployeent Tax Act for each employee to whom you pay \$50 or more during a calendar guarter if, during the current or preceding calendar year, you had one or more employees at any time in each of 20 calendar weeks or you paid wagas of \$1,500 or more in any calendar quarter. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other Federal taxes, please address them to this office.

If your sources of support, or your purposes, character, or method of operation change, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on your exempt status. In the case of an amendment to your organizational document or bylaws, please send us a copy of the amended document or bylaws, Also, you should inform us of all changes in your name or address.

In the heading of this letter we have indicated whether you must file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax. If Yes is indicated, you are required to file Form 990 only if your gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. Nowever, if you receive a Form 990 package in the mail, please file the return even if you do not exceed the gross receipts test. If you are not required to file, simply attach the label provided, check the hox in the heading to indicate that your annual gross receipts are normally \$25,000 or less, and sign the return.
