Thousands of volunteers each year join cleanups on all five Great Lakes and in each of the eight Great Lake states. In addition to keeping Great Lakes beaches and shorelines clean, Adopt-a-Beach volunteers keep about 30,000 pounds of plastic and other litter out of the Great Lakes each year. At Adopt-a-Beach cleanups, locally organized teams of volunteers, led by volunteer Team Leaders, clean local beaches and collect data on the litter they find. After the cleanups end, the Team Leaders enter litter data into the Alliance for the Great Lakes' database, helping form a picture of coastal litter across the entire Great Lakes region. Volunteers have collected 20 years of cleanup data. Scientists use Adopt-a-Beach data to study the sources of plastic pollution, and this information helps decision makers make the case for policies that protect the lakes. Volunteers of all ages and abilities are welcome.
