

**RADIO PSA TITLED "SICK DAY" FROM THE NATIONAL PEST
MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION HIGHLIGHTS HOW PESTS CAN
IMPACT OUR HEALTH AND WELLBEING**

Common pests found in and around homes can pose serious health risks. Outdoors, mosquitoes and ticks are vectors of debilitating diseases like West Nile virus and Lyme disease, and stinging insects, such as yellow jackets, wasps and hornets, send more than half a million people to the emergency room every year. Inside, rodents can spread diseases and contaminate food while cockroach droppings, saliva, and shed skins contain potent allergens that can exacerbate asthma and allergy symptoms — especially in children.

These illnesses can have a devastating toll on our health, daily life and productivity. Pests are often responsible for trips to the emergency room, hospitalizations, missed days at work and time spent away from loved ones. For those who are impacted, this can have major financial implications and adversely affect family members, employers and co-workers. Pest-related illnesses like asthma can also take a serious toll on children's health, leading to missed school days and lower test scores.

Your station can help educate listeners about the significant impact pests can have on our health by airing the PSA titled "Sick Day" (:30, :30). Using a variety of real-life scenarios, this PSA — brought to you by the National Pest Management Association (NPMA) and in consultation with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) — puts the spotlight on all of the problems and losses that can result from having to take sick days due to a pest-related illness. The PSA encourages audiences to seek the facts needed to stay healthy and protected from pests by visiting PestWorld.org, an informational website that offers further details and educational resources. **This PSA has no end date for use.** We ask that you please air this PSA as soon and as often as possible.

MAN V/O: Sorry boss, I'm going to be out of work for awhile.

NARRATOR V/O: The CDC estimates that more than 300,000 Lyme disease cases spread by ticks occur in the U.S. each year. Don't let pests force you to take a sick day.

Dear Applicant:

In your letter dated 01/10/2024, you requested a reclassification of foundation status as a public charity.

Our records indicate you are tax exempt under IRC Section 501(c)(3). You're currently classified as a public charity described in IRC Sections 509(a)(3).

Based on the information you provided, we determined you meet the requirements for classification as a public charity described in IRC Sections (509)(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) and updated our records.

Because your tax-exempt status wasn't under consideration, you continue to be classified as an organization exempt from federal income tax under IRC Section 501(c)(3).

This letter could help resolve questions on your foundation status. Keep it for your records.
